Alternatively, I would happily accept a voucher for my \$12,000+ to send my child to a private academy that knows how to operate within budgetary restrictions. I am tired of paying for the teacher gravy train. How much of the \$12,000 actually goes to each student? What is the ratio spent per teacher vs. child. My husband and I moved to our home for a school system we were told was fantastic. If this is fantastic I am very afraid for the future. I am better off moving to New York City where taxes are low so that I can justify paying for private school. Something has to dramatically change in Middletown and everywhere in this country. We cannot let unions dictate how we live our lives and raise our children. I say throw the union out of our schools and hire non-union teachers at a fair wage without all of the gravy train perks and benefits. The parents of this town should decide how our money is spent. Again it should be spent on children and not teachers. I'd like to know why my child has to play in a broken down play area with dangerous holes in the ground while teachers are getting raise after undeserved raise. Raises in this economy should not exist. Future raises should be strictly merit driven. Tenure should be outlawed now and forever. I attended the last Township Committee meeting. Is it a district's responsibility to provide transportation for students who live less than remote from school when hazardous road conditions exist? A. Boards of education are not required by law to provide busing for students who live less than remote from school even for safety reasons. However, boards are permitted, at their own discretion and expense, to provide transportation for students who reside less than remote from school and may charge the student's parents or legal guardians for this service. Municipalities may also contract with boards of education for this service and charge the parents. How do teachers prove competency when tenure is a job guarantee. How do you make sure teachers are staying up to date when the local word is another 4 day weekend because teachers are not tested in any way once they are in. I also think anyone not directly involved in student teaching, safety, health and sanitation should have to take on some of the teaching and after school tutoring, sports etc. Too much waste in an industry that does not put the kids first. I am appalled that the teachers expect a pay raise rather than save teaching jobs. We staff down at the hospital. Thankyou for asking for comments: I would prefer to not see any further cuts to academic and ancillary school programs at all. I supported the budget that failed. Nonetheless, if spending reductions are required I would like to see parents have the option of paying for the extras that their kids get. For instance, in middle school, I believe the Cross Country program is invaluable because it gives kids a purpose, has them work for a goal, supports participation by all kids (a no cut team), is healthy, supports teamwork, school spirit, etc. If I have to pay for my son to join it so the program stays alive I will do so, and I think other parents will too. Maybe that can be the way to save other programs that have proposed for cutting. Let's have fundraisers and/or ask parents of those needing them to kick in money if absolutely necessary. I would also like to see the electives added back into the High School course selection (such as Architecture). Cutting electives would always come before core subjects, but that comes at a price. Kids have little exposure to fields that they can consider for a career and need more electives to get an idea of what they might like. I would rather pay for that now by paying for high school courses which are much cheaper than having my child "explore" his way through college, paying a small fortune to figure out the career and course of study that is right for him. As far as a salary freeze, I would support that if it preserves those people's jobs and also stops further cuts (or at least minimizes them), but of course that is for the union to decide. They have to decide whether they can live with that, or if they will sacrifice more of their own union members in order to preserve their own raises. The point here is that everyone is in a tough economy. As I see it, your job is to ensure that you are still offering my children a comprehensive educational experience that is no way inferior to that has been offered to all Middletown children over the past years. Children that are in the system right now - in this economy - should not bear the brunt of these cuts just because they happen to be currently in their education years. It is not their fault we are in this mess and we have to do our best to make sure are delivering a consistent education over the years. Of course there is always room for belt tightening, but I think the belt is already too tight and unfortunately my children and those in their critical years in the Middletown Schools will suffer if adults are not sensible about the cuts they are making. People would rather decide amongst options, rather than be asked to propose what or what not to cut; that would become a frenzy that will only serve the people that have the time and volition to press their agenda or standpoint - it will not serve all of Middletown. Having put 2 children through Middletown Schools, I know there were a small number of teachers who were there to collect a pay check only. In reviewing the school payroll, there are 3 things that jump out - the large number of teachers with 30+ years of experience, the total number of employees on the district office payroll that do not teach and the seemingly unwarranted number of assistant principals (12) in the 2 high schools. I have been following the ongoing school talks between the NJEA and Governor Christie. My wife and I are 100% behind the Governor and here's why. New Jersey presently has an \$11 billion deficit. You can't raise the sales tax to 10% and double the property taxes to close the gap because so many will flee New Jersey to go elsewhere. So to close this gap every New Jersey resident has to sacrifice. I travel to New York every day to work and because the Governor cut the subsidy to New Jersey Transit all New Jersey Transit train and bus fares rose 25% beginning May 1. My monthly train pass rose to \$291 from \$233, a \$58 dollar increase. I'm not happy but I understand the Governor did not have the money in his budget to give the subsidy New Jersey Transit needed. So I sacrificed \$58.00 a month, or \$696 a year. I think teachers, as well as all government employees (municipal workers, police, firemen) should accept a one year pay freeze and pay 5% of their health care costs, not 1.5% that the Governor wants. Very few of my friends have pensions and the ones that do get a very minimal amount. My cousin is a principal in Manahawkin, New Jersey, and he told me his pension will pay him 75% of his last year salary. Add in 403, 457 contributions and Social Security, and my cousin will retire with more money on an annual basis than his last year salary. That's unfair and I told him that. My pension and social security will replace only 35% of my last year's salary. I will need over \$1.5 million in a 401K plan, along with a pension and social security, to replace 75% of my last year pay. How am I going to save that amount of money when my present bills are sky-high. When I retire I will have to move out of New Jersey or rent an apartment because I will not be able to pay my property taxes and pay for health care on a fixed income. So while the state suffers my cousin and his teachers union want 4% raises and they don't want to contribute a dime to their health care plan. This is one of the reasons why we're in this mess! Greed, Greed Greed. Everyone wants health care, but they want other people to pay for it instead of contributing to it like everyone else. You want to save teacher jobs. Accept the Governor's proposal on pay and use some of the teachers union dues to pay for health care. I don't know of any industry where a worker pays more in union dues than to their health care. It's time for everyone to sacrifice. Will the teachers accept the sacrifice that myself and so many fellow train and bus riders had to accept this May? My property taxes are up 50% in seven years and I live in a part of Middletown (Twin Brooks) where my property taxes don't even include garbage pickup. I have to pay for garbage pickup on my own. I won't even talk about how myself and so many neighbors got shafted with the new assessment of our homes. That's a discussion for another day. I love this state but hate all the shenanigans from Trenton. If taxes and costs continue to rise whose gonna be able to afford New Jersey in the future? While that is true, it is reasonable to ask that public employees accept a one year wage freeze. Others towns have done this. By doing so, the public employees will be assisting their co-workers with the lowest seniority by helping them avoid lay-offs. I believe that the voters sent the message loud and clear. As I'm sure you're aware, Middletown's K12 district spends below the state per pupil average for similar districts, and has done so for many years, yet the state penalized them BIG TIME. So much for being fiscally prudent. In terms of special needs children, as a percentage of the total student population, Middletown exceeds the state average by about 3 points. Since the state mandates various programs for classified children, it seems unlikely that you'll consider any cuts in that area, and rightly so, but you need to consider how further cuts would affect the larger non-classified student base. Do you really want to shortchange their educational experience any further? I think that Middletown has done a fine job educating a large and diverse student population for many years, but some people don't want to hear it unless it benefits them directly. In order to solve your budget problem, I strongly urge you to eliminate school sports—or if they are continued, have parents pay for their child to participate, as they do for hockey, sailing, Pop Warner, gymnastics, and more. Yes, sports are a motivator for students to do well; however, if played privately, not on the taxpayer's bill, there is no reason that grades and behavior can't still be tied to participation. Sports benefit only a few students, with the highest end and most expensive ones benefitting the least number of students. Cutting teachers and academic programs hurts all students and the fundamental mission of the school system. What good is a citizen who can toss a football into an endzone, but can't balance a checkbook? In other words, don't sacrifice basic education such as math for extras like the football team! After school sports, I would look into other extracurriculars, keeping in mind that school is there to teach, and students can have fun on their own. Finally, there are a few smaller areas where extra money could be found. I would freeze any new textbook purchases, as they are highly overrated and often renewed long before their useful life is up. I would seriously look at what technology is being paid for. Many times it is being used for technology's sake, and not actually benefitting the learning. I know I have been asked to force certain equipment into lessons that really didn't help it. Turn the heat down and skip the AC. Ask teachers to be more frugal with supplies, especially paper. Discourage bussing and encourage students biking and walking to school. Cancel professional development for a few years—except for new teachers who need to learn your programs. Teachers can be very resourceful in learning new things on their own when given the time. They also need time to practice the current programs before new things are thrown at them. What I definitely recommend against is anything that increases class size. As a teacher, I can state with certainty that the number one way to increase the quality of any educational system is to simply reduce the class size. A teacher has more time to spend on each student, and discipline problems will be reduced. The teacher will also have less paperwork and more time to be creative in developing lessons. More active lessons can be planned because fewer children equals less potential for chaos. Middletown is currently known for its excellent schools. I have subbed in the district and was impressed, myself. If the class size goes up, the quality of the education will drop very quickly, and the reputation will be lost. A further solution, but not with immediate monetary results, is to remind the town that "it takes a village." Encourage parents and the residents as a whole to instill in their young children—whether their own, a family member's or a neighbor's—a love of learning, respect for teachers and others, and interest in books from an early age. They should also look out for the best in the nutrition of children to increase students' abilities to focus and learn to their potentials. Revamping school lunches to include whole grain

bread, low sugar foods, lots of fruits and vegetables, and no junk food machines or options would be a part of this. In the long run, many extra services may be able to be eliminated as a result of these measures. Residents need to remember that it is not solely the school's job to raise children. I don't think that any of these suggested measures will meet with great applause, but cutting teachers is a far worse choice. It is the easiest way to save money, I realize, but we must remember that what is easy is not always what is right. With a fine toothed comb passing through every school and across every decision maker's desk, I am certain that the money to save those very important and necessary jobs can be found. Please accept this challenge and I will look forward to sending my daughter to Middletown schools in five years. Thank you for your consideration with my tax dollars. Also, since students possess many different learning styles I hope that no arts, music, or physical/sports programs and activities are cut. Well rounded students are a necessity for college acceptance. If you are dismantling elementary school computer labs, please make sure that all classrooms throughout the district have access to using computers as part of their programs. In order to make up the shortfall from the voters' clear rejection of the budget, the teachers should accept a pay freeze. Serious cuts in administrative positions are also necessary and seemingly well overdue. I was stunned to see on the Middletown Township Public Schools website the number of unnecessary and redundant administrative positions. High School North has three Asst. Principals for Operations and two Asst. Principals for Curriculum. High School South has two Asst. Principals for Operations and two Asst. Principals for Curriculum. This is absolutely ridiculous, and in these economic times, an insult to Middletown taxpayers. In the private sector, companies eliminate unnecessary and redundant positions when their business and/or the economy requires. The responsibilities of those positions are absorbed by other employees who do not get a salary increase with the added responsibilities. Middletown might want to give that concept a try. Perhaps have one Asst. Principal per school who is in charge of curriculum, guidance, and operations. This might even justify the overly generous salaries and benefits they already receive. Teaching positions also need to be eliminated. Increasing class sizes to 25-30 students is still well within reasonable bounds. Increasing teaching loads and eliminating unpopular high school electives would also be useful. What the school system needs to become accustomed to is dealing with budget shortfalls the way the private sector does. Difficult times call for difficult actions, and it is time for Middletown schools to face the realities of today's economy. Contracts must be renegotiated. District teachers and administrators must start contributing a fair amount toward their benefits. The starting salary for Middletown teachers is well above that of employees in other sectors who are required to pay a great deal toward their benefits. So the standard argument that teacher benefits are so generous because their pay is so small just doesn't ring true here. You might also consider pooling and reducing maintenance staff and other suitable categories of staff so that they are one group responding to the needs of the different schools rather than a separate group of staff at each school. The biggest mistake the township committee could make would be to ignore the mandate they were given by the voters to make serious cuts. To instead settle on the charade of a cursory, ineffectual budget cut, dismissing the will of the voters, will ensure rapid turnover of committee members with each election cycle as well as future budget defeats. Make the tough changes now.
